Witwer spoke on the Sum-

mer Institute for Rural Youths, held at Bloomsburg State College in July, 1970.

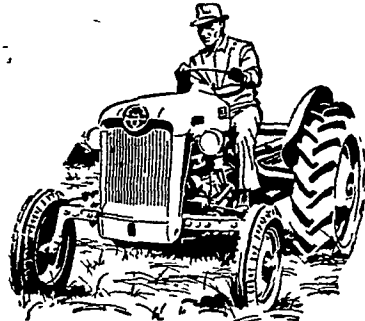

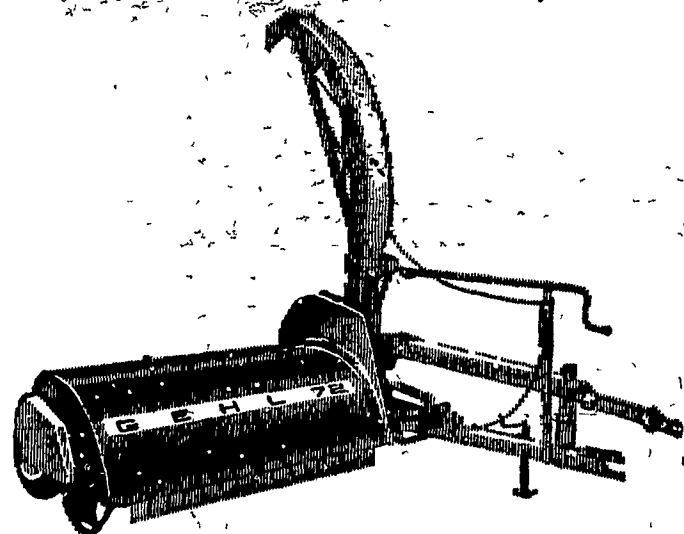
