

A Frost-Free Appliance Is Not Care-Free

Frost-free lefingerator-freezers are certainly work savers However you do need to clean these appliances thoroughly a few times each year It really is easy since

the messy ice melting process is no more

For safety, first unplug the refrigerator and turn all controls to "off", especially the signal aim of an automatic icemaker if you have one

Take out all fcod and protect flozen items from thawing Remove all parts such as crispers, meat pans, shelves. and light fixtures The instruction booklet will explain how to do this Read it carefully'

At the sink, wash everything in warm sudsy water A gentle-action scouring pad may be used to clean stubborn food particles from racks Be sure to remove and wash the water evaporating tray and air grill below the unit

With the cievice tool attach-where dust may collect Then wipe the entire inside of the refrigerator and freezer Refit components and replace food, wiping all jars and containers with a sudsy sponge first Plug in the appliance and tuin contiols on


