Mrs. Clarence Stauffer, vice president, gave the report of the Executive board meeting. The group voted in favor of supporting the Child Development Center for the County project.

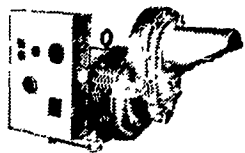
Miss Judy Longenecker, an IFYE exchange student, showed slides and told of her travels in the United Kingdom.
