> Genetic quality is included, Dr. Gerhold pointed out, based on potentials for growth rate, density and shape, and needle color Predictions are made for suitable planting sites in Pennsylvania and nearby states.

Data for the guide will be obtained each September and October by specialists in forest genetics, he explained Each participating nursery is visited, seed documents are checked, and genetic identity of each variety is verified by checking characteristics in nursery beds. Measurements are made for later statistical analysis. If the genetic identity or physical condition of a variety seems questionable or undesirable, it is eliminated from the guide.

The Pennsylvania Tree Improvement Foundation is sponsored jointly by the Pennsylvania Christmas Tree Growers Association and the School of Forest Resources at Penn State. Cooperating on the project at Penn State is Edgar H Palpant, research assistant in forestry
