The Garden Spot Young Farmers banquet featured the corn grain and corn silage contest winners and installation of officers.

The banquet at the Blue Ball Fire Hall last Friday night included first place awards to William Fisher, East Earl RD1, for the top corn grain produc-

tion and to Frank Yost, Narvon RD2, for top corn silage production. Fisher had 192.4 bushels per acre and Yost's

corn tested at 14,985 pounds of TDN per acre.

Other top corn grain winners were: Harold Wissler, New Holland RD1, second with 189.5 bushels per acre; Larry Weaver, New Holland RD1, third, 181 bushels; Frank Yost, Narvon RD2, fourth, 177.2 bushels, and Loren Zimmerman, East Earl RD1, fifth, 168.6.

Corn silage winners included: Andrew Stoltzfus, Elverson RD2, second, 14,950 pounds of TDN per acre; Larry Weaver, New Holland RD1, third, 12,875; William Fisher, East Earl RD1, fourth, 12,840 pounds, and Harold Wissler, New Holland RD1, fifth, 12,150.
