**PA. COW MAKES "4E"**

A Registered Holstein cow in the herd of George and Harold Hasbrouck, Titusville, Pa., has joined a select group of 36 other cows of the breed to be designated "4E."

The "E" designation indicates excellence in body conformation. Four indicates a cow has maintained this "Excellent" classification scoring 90 points or more on four different occasions as she grew older.

Clyma Hasbrouck's Family Man 4683353 was classified "Excellent" for the fourth time last month at the age of 12 years 4 months. She completed her highest single record at the age of 7 years 4 months when she produced 22,430 pounds of milk and 903 pounds of butterfat in 323 days and has a lifetime production of 144,530 pounds of milk and 5,845 pounds of butterfat. She was sired by Woodbourne Family Man 1279466.
