The next meeting of the Society will be April 14 when a tour of Lancaster County, directed by Mrs Edith Metzler, will be taken.

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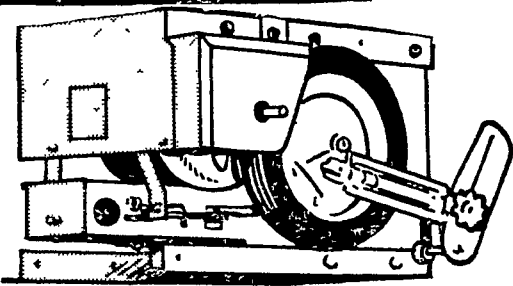
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
