

Women's Group Gives Book on Food to Public Schools

Mrs. Jesse Wood, chairman of the Women's Committee of the Lancaster County Farmers Association and Mrs. Clyde Wivell, of the State Women's Committee met with Dr. H. K. Gerlach, County Superintendent of Schools at the Farm and Home Center.

The purpose of the meeting was to familiarize Dr. Gerlach with the book "Food From Farm To Home."

As an aid in creating a better understanding of American agriculture and its remarkable contributions to the growth and development of this country, Lancaster County Farmers Association plans to present "Food From Farm to Home" to Elementary Schools in Lancaster County.

Dr. Gerlach heartily approved the project and expressed gratitude to the Farmers Association for their interest. The Women's Committee will be in charge of distributing the books.

The book, written and illustrated by Walter Buehr, well

known author of children's textbooks on industrial subjects, examines modern farming techniques as well as recalling the pioneer farm, and explains the important role played by agriculture in everyday living.

Published by the Wm Morrow and Co., Inc., of New York City, the book fills a need often cited by elementary teachers for authentic material on how food is produced through the cycle of planting and food production. Early day and modern machinery used in farming is graphically illustrated in near accurate detail by author Buehr.

Every type of agriculture is discussed in "Food From Farm to Home" and the author points out that farmers comprise less than six per cent of our population.

Today each farmer grows enough to feed 42 persons. How the farmer accomplishes this feat is a story of interest to all.

Mrs. Wood stated, "The Lancaster County Farmers Association is pleased to present this book by Mr. Buehr in as much as we feel that we're living in a fast changing world and nearly an entire generation has grown up and wonder at the mystery of how and where all those products on the supermarket shelves originally came from and who is responsible for this abundance of food."

"Whatever we do in life depends on the price we are willing to pay or the time we give. In return we get satisfaction, happiness, a better country, nation and world. The world is always in need of men and women willing to bear it's burdens."

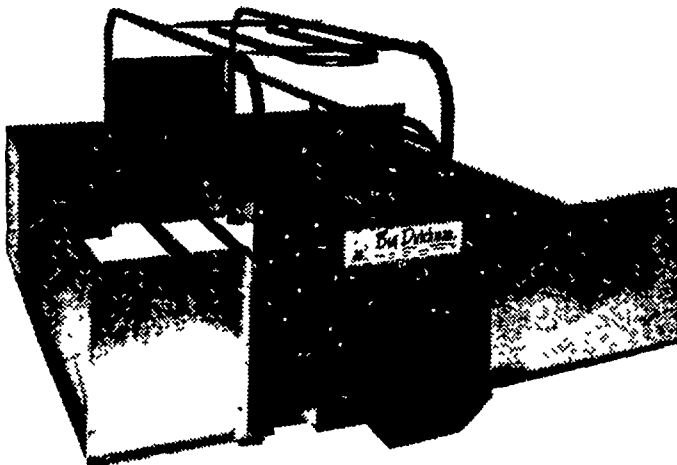

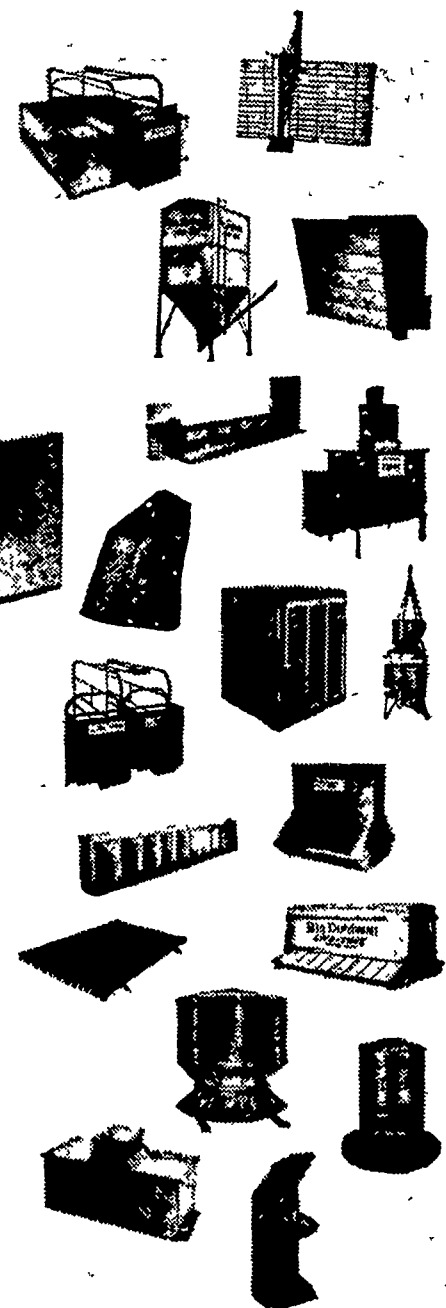
