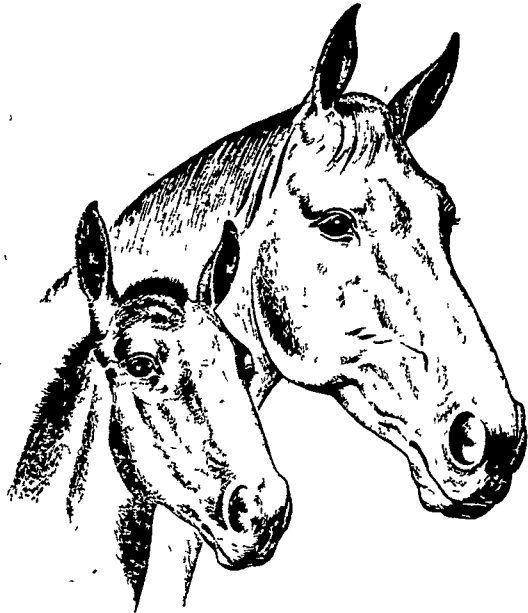

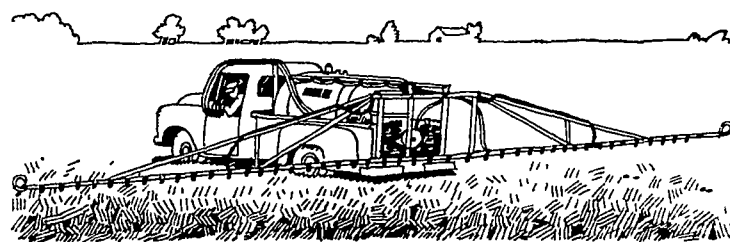
Extension Board Elects
