

# Octorara Young Farmers Assn. Banquet Honors Members

The Octorara Young Farmers Association held its annual banquet at the Atglen Fire Hall last Thursday.

Receiving recognition for having the most outstanding dairy cow was Nelson Stoltzfus, Atglen RD1. With a Holstein on a 305 day milking, Stoltzfus had 23,495 pounds of milk and a 4.9 per cent butterfat test with 1,152 pounds of butterfat.

Second place went to Paul King, Cochranville RD1, for a

cow with a production of 24,734 pounds of milk, a 3.9 per cent test and 961 pounds of butterfat.

Third place went to Carl Horst, Cochranville RD1, with 16,508 pounds of milk, 4.8 test, and 793 pounds of fat.

In the high herd competition, Paul King's herd of 592 cows had an average production of 16,609 pounds of milk and 633 pounds of butterfat.

Nelson Stoltzfus had 50.5 cows

with 15,416 pounds of milk and 603 pounds of butterfat.

Landis Reid, Parkesburg RD1, was third with 312 cows, 15,477 pounds of milk and 579 pounds of butterfat.

Both contests were based on butterfat content.

In the corn grain contest, Paul King was first with 260 bushels per acre.

Carl Horst was second with 196.25 bushels per acre.

Larry Hershey, Cochranville RD1, was third with 166.3 bushels per acre, followed by Earl Mast, Star Route Parkesburg, fourth, 162.9; Landis Reid, fifth, 152.1; Ivan Yost, Christiana RD1, sixth, 149.7.

In the corn silage contest, Ivan Yost was first with 17,816 pounds of TDN (Total Digestible Nutrients) per acre.

Paul King was second with 15,636.2 per acre.

William Parry III, Cochranville RD1, was third with 11,960 pounds of TDN, followed by Nelson Stoltzfus, fourth, 11,470; Larry Hershey, fifth, 9,870; Carl Horst, sixth, 9,750.

In the hay contest, based on per cent of TDN in sample, Elmer Mast, Parkesburg RD1, was first with 64 per cent.

Ivan Yost was second with 63 per cent and William Parry III was third with 61 per cent, followed by Aldus King, Parkesburg RD1, fourth, 60 per cent.

Mel Horst entertained with a

series of slides on hunting in Arizona and Wyoming.

The following officers were elected: Nelson Stoltzfus, president; Carl Horst, vice president; Larry Hershey, secretary; Paul King, treasurer; and Elmer Mast, public relations. Ivan Stauffer, Octorara vo-ag teacher, is advisor.

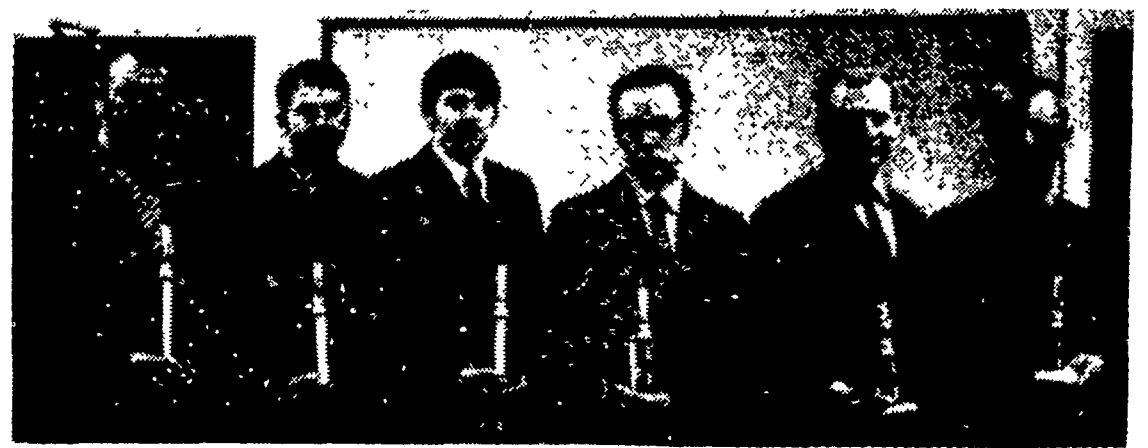





