Judge for the roundup was Richard Reiner, 413 Lampeter Road, Lancaster.

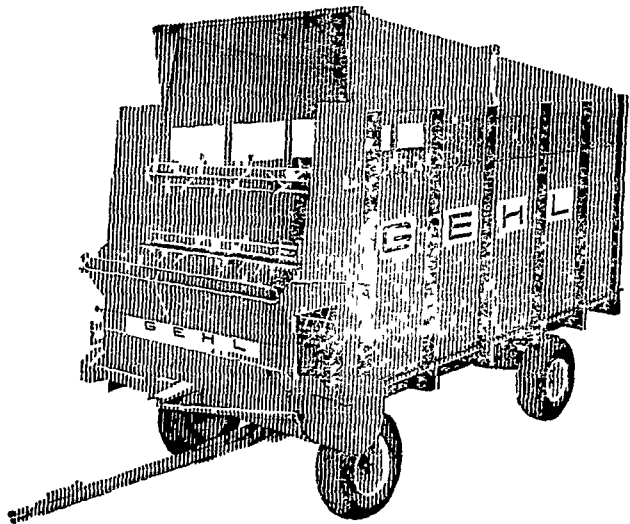
Appropriate prize money was awarded to participants in the roundup.

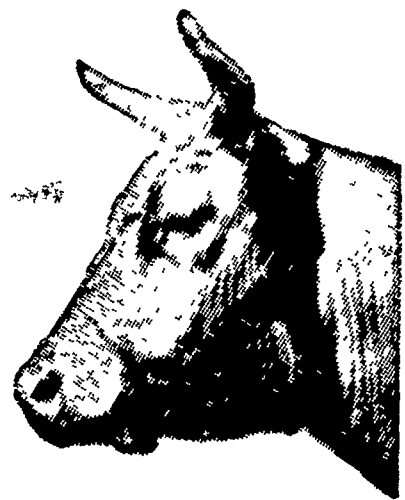
