About The Mini-Washer

If you're in the market for a new washing machine, the new portable mini-washer may have caught your eye. It is less expensive than the family-size automatic washer. It takes no special plumbing, and fits into a smaller space.

But the mini doesn't replace the regular automatic washer.

You need to consider things other than price, plumbing, and space. For example, the roomy family-size washer takes a load up to 12 to 16 pounds. Washloads for the mini-washer vary from three to six pounds.

The portable minis are not truly automatic. You wash clothes in a tub that's filled by a hose connected to your kitchen sink faucet. When the wash cycle ends, you have to lift the clothes into a second tub where excess water is spun out. Then you can rinse out the clothes in either tub.

You can complete a small amount of laundry in about 10 minutes in a mini-washer. However, during the 10 minutes, you must be on hand to do the lifting and switching. This can be tiring and time consuming if you have several loads to do.

The portable mini-washer isn't ideal for large family loads. However, it has a real value as a second washer for personal clothing.

It also has a place in a vaca-

tion home, in the home of a single person where there may not be room for a regular washer, or in an apartment where no special plumbing is available for a regular washer.

And with a portable mini-washer in a closet or under a counter, you can do your laundry at your own convenience in your own home.

Proper Care of Rainwear

Winter weather is giving way to spring — spring rains, included. And you will be relying on your rainwear instead of your high boots, and heavy coat.

If you take proper care of your rainwear it will do a better job of protecting you against the spring rain drops.

As with other garments, rainwear care suggested by the manufacturer is determined by the type of fabric, construction, trims and detailing of the type of finish on the garment.

If your raincoat is labeled "washable" or "wash only," its water repellent finish may be a type that partially dissolves in a dry-cleaning solvent but isn't affected if you launder it.

A raincoat labeled "dry clean only" may have a finish that was applied in a water solution. Laundering will cause "dry clean only" rainwear to lose some of its water-repellent finish.

Many raincoats now on the market have durable press finishes. If you have one of these, wash and dry it using warm water and warm heat, as you would for other durable press garments.

When you launder rainwear, be sure to rinse all detergent out of the garment. Detergent left in the fabric will decrease its water repellency.

Clean vinyl rainwear by washing the surface with a sudsy cloth or sponge. Since most vinyl raincoats cannot be dry-cleaned, buy one with a colored lining that doesn't show the soil.

Spring rains will not go away with a wish, but properly cared for rainwear will make the season, and the rain, more enjoyable.

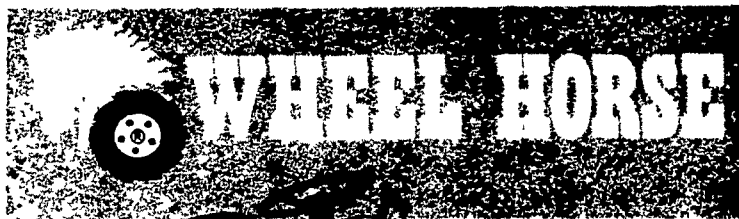
