award at the "Good Egg Banquet" in Baltimore April 22 The banquet kicks off the annual "May is Egg Month" campaign.

Becherman has worked for Smelkinson Brothers for 25 years He is now in charge of egg buying and merchandising operations, and has developed the business into one of the largest and most efficient egg procurement and marketing agencies in the nation.

He was recently one of ten people recognized by the U.S. egg industry for efforts to promote the industry in 1970.

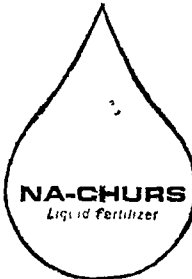

What's New?

Uniform Seed Size

A Dutch company which has specialized for over a century in refining, producing and selling vegetable and flower seeds has now developed, after long and intensive research, a special process for pelleting or encasing seeds.

The seeds, which are often small and irregular, become larger and acquire uniform dimensions as a result of the pelleting

The seed company, Royal Sluis of Enkhuizen, the Netherlands, disclosed that its pelleted seeds can then be handled mechanically and can be sown without difficulty by precision sowing machines made by a different Dutch concern. Both the seeds and the spreader are now available for export to the United States and other countries.

The coating of the pellet is composed of neutral inorganic substances which do not affect germination in any way; the coating does not contain any fertilizers or pesticides. The pelleted seeds are very sturdy and have a high specific gravity.

Seeds are pelleted only if they meet stringent requirements as to germinative power, purity and grade quality. Every batch of seeds intended for pelleting is cleaned very carefully and undesirable parts are removed.
