> > Some provisions include that a minimum of five acres devoted to agriculture or horticulture for at least two years before application and that application for taxation under the new law must be made every year by the owner at no fee The land must gross at least \$500 per year from agricultural or horticultural sales and that a state committee shall recommend land assessment values based on capability of the land as determined by soil survey, use such as crop land and wool land, and capitalization of net farm income for each coun-

The proposal would be similar to what is known as the New Jersey plan and the state assessment law would be ammended to allow the assessment formula to include the earning power of property as a basis for assessment, along with assessment based on market value

Other PFA positions announced on legislative proposals in-

-Opposition to an ammendment to the Pennsylvania Constitution to reduce the size of the House to 121 members and the Senate to 41.

-On a bill to regulate snowmobiles, the PFA is seeking an amendment that would require permission of landowners before snowmobiles could be operated on private land.

-Opposes a bill allowing Sunday sale of liquor in restaurants having dollar volume of food in excess of 30 per cent of gross

-Opposes bill requiring dating of packages of all perishable

-Supports bill allowing school boards to establish either four quarters or three trimesters of school in each school year with students required to attend three quarters or two trimesters per year

-PFA supports principle of bill permitting certain counties to make agreements with land owners for preservation of farm land, forest, water and open spaces The proposal removes the requirement that the area must be defined as urban by the Federal Government


