Jack Tracy and four other citizens were at the meeting to present facts on the pollution of the Conestoga Creek, including growing silt and odor problems.

The citizens asked for help in cleaning up the problems.

Dell Hartman, a local boat company owner, said the depth in the Conestoga in recent years has been reduced to about one foot, compared to three to four feet in the past.

It was reported that, following a meeting Monday involving State Department of Transportation officials and Orval Bass, Lancaster County soil conservationist steps will be taken by the state to alleviate flooding problems on Cocalico Creek in connection with construction of the new route 222.

The name of Ralph E. Har-nish, Bart Township, 115 acres, was removed.

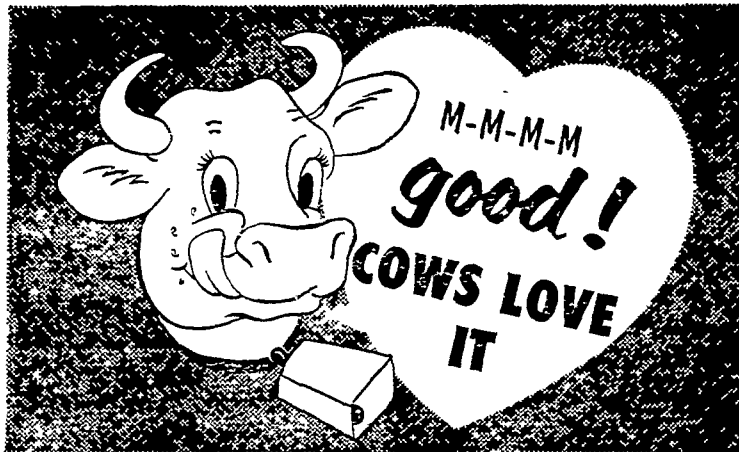
