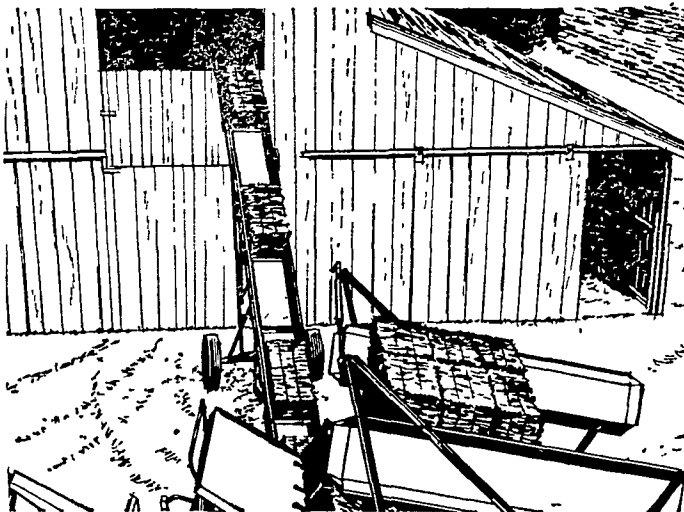
## Pa. Plow Contest Set September 1

The Rock Springs Agricultural Research Center of Pennsylvania State University has been selected as the site for the 1971 State Plowing Contest, it was announced recently by Charles Slaton, general chairman.

Slaton, a member of the U.S. Soil Conservation Service staff, Harrisburg, said the plowing matches will be held September 1 as part of the 1971 Agricultural Progress Days scheduled for August 31-September 1 and 2 at the 1,800-acre Penn State research complex.

Plowmen will be eligible to enter three divisions this year. These are small plow, level land; large plow, level land; and contour. Contestants must be declared winners of county eliminations prior to entering state competition.

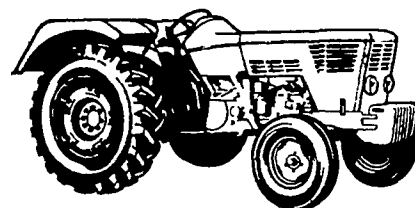
