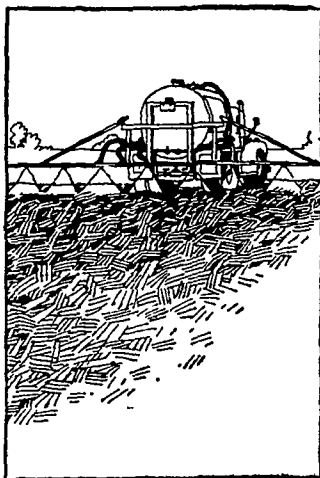
There were 240 cattle in the show with an average weight of 1,212 pounds bringing an average price of 33 29. This amount was about the same as last year, with prices higher than October's sale.

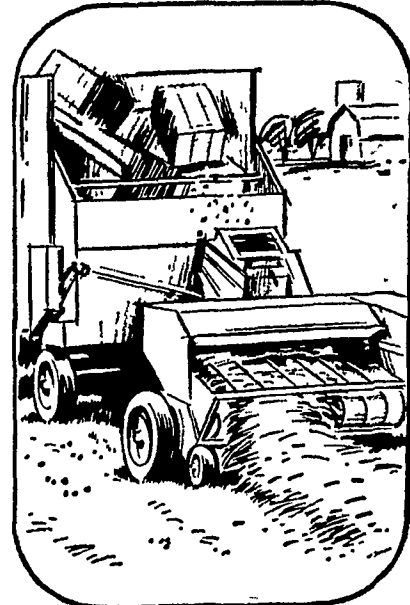
