

Club Plans Annual Horse Show May 1

The fifth annual Lanchester Pony Club Horse Show will be held on Saturday, May 1, at Pony Club Headquarters at the John Gibson farm at Drumore. The show grounds overlook the Susquehanna River off Route 272 near Wakefield.

This year's show will have 30 classes of horses and ponies with Junior riders through age 21. A special feature will be classes open to Pony Club members only with riders competing from Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware, and New Jersey Pony Clubs.

Mrs Presnikoff is chairman of the instruction committee, a member of the Board of Governors, and a national examiner of the United States Pony Clubs. Colonel Thackeray is the current chairman of the dressage committee of the U. S Pony Clubs and the American Horse Show Association. He is the U. S representative on the international dressage committee.

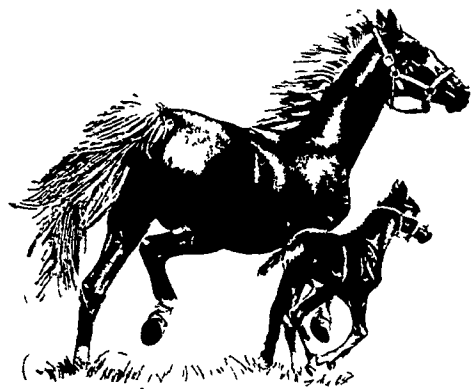
Miss Powers is a national examiner of the U S Pony Clubs and Mr Murray is district commissioner of Delaware Pony Club.

The May 1 horse show is the only fund raising event of the year for Lanchester Pony Club. Proceeds will benefit a program of riding for handicapped children, an exchange program with Pony Clubs in other areas of the country, the summer camp and clinic, and rally competition with other clubs. District commissioners are Mrs George Hassler II, Hidden Acres Farm, and Joseph Little, RD3, both of Quarryville.

A member of Lanchester Pony Club, Ralph Hill of Hillview Farms, Lincoln University, has been selected to represent the U S Pony Clubs in an exchange program in Great Britain in September. He was one of six riders selected from 22 competitors at the screening trials held on April 9 and 10 at Lanchester Pony Club headquarters by the National Exchange Committee of the U S Pony Clubs.
