All offices of the executive committee, excluding those of president and vice-president, will be up for election in 1972. Following ratification of the nine members of the ADA executive committee by the delegates, the committee selected officers.

## Pa. Honey Prices Drop

Wholesale honey prices received by Pennsylvania apiarists last year averaged 16 cents a pound, down 2 cents from 1969 prices, according to the State Crop Reporting Service.

Honey production amounted to 3.8 million pounds, 12 per cent more than in 1969. Yield per colony was 39 pounds, the highest since 1964. Beeswax production totaled 67,000 pounds, down 7,000 pounds from 1969.

Nationally, honey production was 23,931 tons less than in 1969. In California, the largest honey-producing state in the nation, production dropped 15,418 tons.

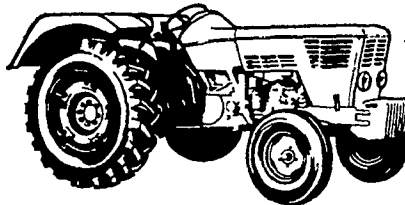
