### Meat Law Cited

Agriculture Secretary James McHale said recently some meat slaughtering and processing firms in Pennsylvania operate under unsanitary conditions.

"I have asked the office of the attorney general to initiate necessary legal procedures to compel offending establishments to comply with the (Meat and Poultry Hygiene) law, which provides for the slaughter and processing of sound and healthy livestock and poultry under sanitary conditions," McHale said.

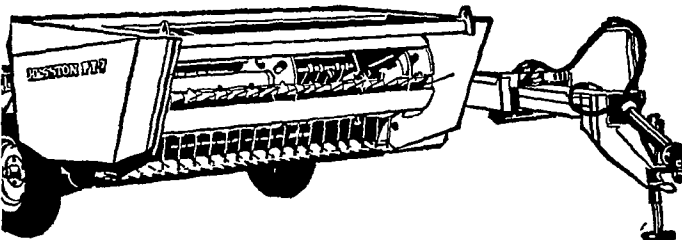
