**Rough Riders 4-H Club**

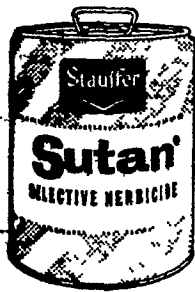
The following were chosen recently as officers for the Rough Riders 4-H Horse and Pony Club: Nancy Henkel,

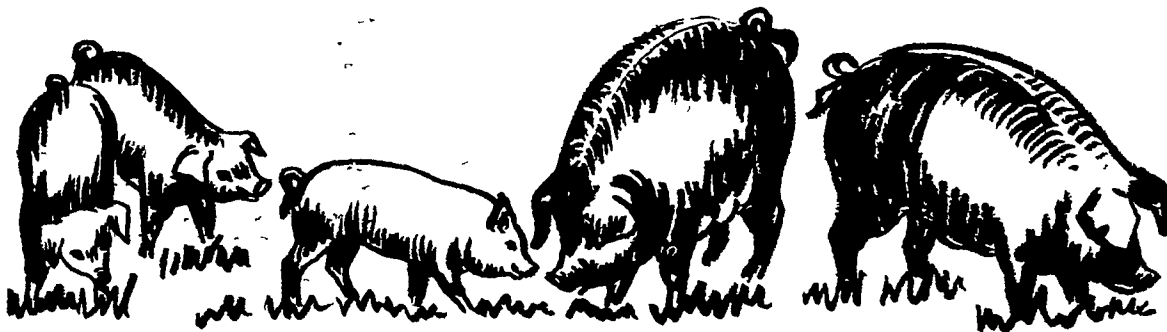
