

## District 4-H Show - Sale Slated December 7-8

The Southeast District 4-H Beef Show and Sale will be held at the Union Stock Yards December 7 and 8, according to Max Smith, Lancaster County agricultural agent.

Of the three counties participating, Lancaster County reported 130 steers on feed, and Chester and Dauphin counties reported 36 each. Since some of these animals will be held for the Farm Show, Smith said he expects about 125 for the annual District Show and Sale.

The Union Stock Yards Company will again furnish suitable show and sale facilities.

The sale will again be sponsored by the Lancaster Livestock Exchange. William McCoy Jr is president.

The steers will arrive Tuesday, December 7 and will be judged and sold on December 8.

## Help Sought for 4-H Nutrition

Both participants and leaders, including teens and adults, are being sought for the expanded nutrition youth program, according to Mrs. Kay Maisano, nutrition assistant with the Penn

State Extension Service, working with Mrs. Doris Thomas, Extension Home Economist.

Mrs. Maisano said the program is primarily available to youths from nine to 19 who want to be 4-H members, but there is also material in the program for children as young as three. While the emphasis is on food and nutrition, other 4-H projects are available, she said.

She expressed particular interest in getting older 4-H members, from 15 to 19, who would like to be Teen Leaders. Teens are particularly needed in the Lancaster and Solanco areas, she said. Some adult project leaders are also needed, she said.

The program is designed to reach children who have not had this type of club experience.

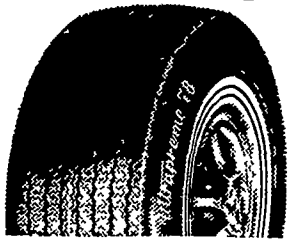
