Roll in small balls in palm of your hand. Put hole in center with lolly-pop stick or plastic straw and fill hole with currant or mint jelly. Bake at 350 to 375 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes.

**PUMPKIN PIES**  
2 cups mashed pumpkin  
1½ cups granulated sugar  
3 tablespoons flour  
4 tablespoons browned butter  
1 teaspoon cloves  
1 teaspoon cinnamon

½ teaspoon nutmeg  
1 teaspoon salt  
4 egg yolks  
3 cups milk  
4 egg white (beaten)

Add beaten egg white last to mixture but stir in thoroughly. Bake in 3 unbaked 9 inch pie shells at 400 degrees until knife clears, about 35 to 40 minutes.

**BUTTER SPONGE CAKE**  
¾ cup egg yolks (about 11)

2 cups granulated sugar  
1 cup boiling water  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
2¼ cups sifted all purpose flour  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
2½ tablespoons powdered milk  
¼ pound melted margarine or butter  
½ teaspoon salt  
Beat egg yolks and sugar until light yellow and fluffy. Add

water slowly and vanilla. (Other flavors may be used or 1½ teaspoon spices)

Sift flour, baking powder, salt and powdered milk and add to liquid batter. Fold melted margarine in thoroughly. Place in long pan, greased and floured. Bake at 350 degrees for 50 to 60 minutes.

**ICING**  
¼ lb. margarine  
1 8-ounce pkg. cream cheese (room temperature)  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1 pound 10X sugar  
Beat all together well in mixer.

## Pork Barbecue Planned

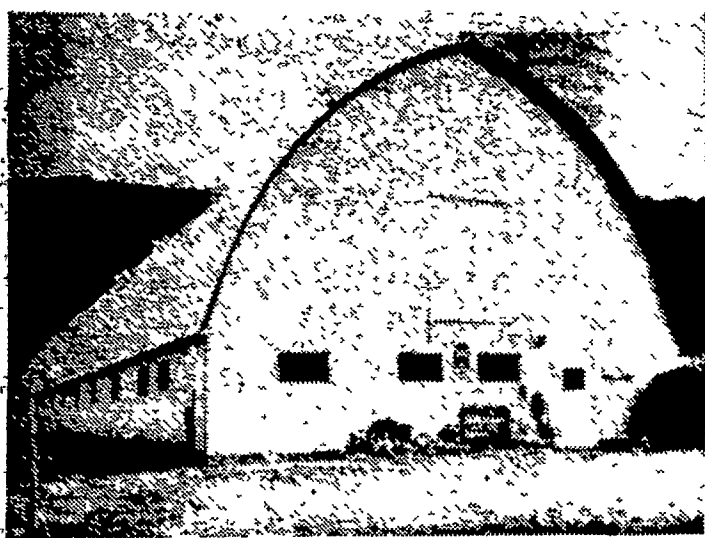
The New Providence United Church of Christ will hold a pork chop barbecue from 4 to 7 p.m. May 29 at the church.

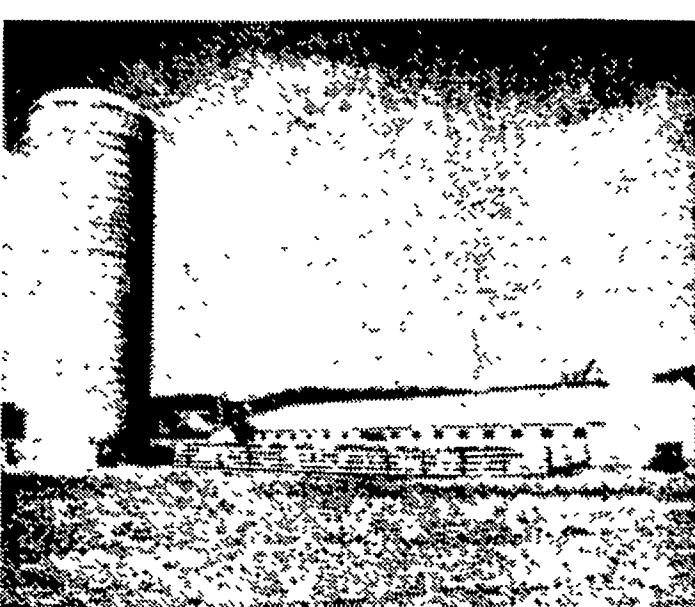
