Residents Urged to License Dogs

Records at the office of the Lancaster County Treasurer reveals that approximately 15,000 county residents have not licensed their dogs for 1971.

Ed Osborne, Peach Bottom, state dog law enforcement officer of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, for this area, said today that he has filed prosecutions against six dog owners for not having license. Osborne said he will continue to spot check and anyone found harboring an unlicensed dog will be prosecuted. The

minimum fine is \$10 with a maximum of \$300 plus costs.

Osborne urges all dog owners to make certain their dogs are licensed and kept under reasonable control, thus respecting both the community and the Law.

"Be a good neighbor, control your dog," Osborne said.

Osborne noted that dog control is of particular importance to farmers because sheep, poultry and other livestock are being killed or damaged by dogs nearly every day.

Extension Agent Cited

Ward M. Stover, Indiana County Extension agricultural agent, has been named state winner in the fourth annual Public Information Awards Contest sponsored by the Na-

tional Association of County Agricultural Agents.

The contest, conducted by the Pennsylvania county agents organization, in cooperation with Amchem Products, Inc., is designed to recognize excellence in the use of mass media approaches in Extension teaching and information programs.

Max Smith, Lancaster County agricultural agent, chairman of the state public information committee, announced the award selection recently.

Stover's entry, a five-minute taped radio program on agricultural topics, was aired on an Indiana radio station. Judging stressed informational value, timeliness, organization, technical quality, and style.

The winning program will be judged in regional competition with awards being presented at the national county agents association annual meeting at Ohio State University in September.
