Pa. Egg Marketing Association Meets

At the May 14 meeting of the Pennsylvania Egg Marketing Association, Ben Burkholder introduced James York, USDA Area Supervisor, Philadelphia, who had Richard Shockley, the Federal-State Supervisor with him.

York explained that a serious attempt is being made to obtain greater state support in the new Egg Products Act "Insofar as possible, state employees should be recruited for breaking plants and they will be supervised by USDA technicians on egg breaking regulations and procedures. Presently two-thirds of the Federal-State programs in this area are state employees.

"Thus far 65 plants have been surveyed and it is anticipated that approximately 20 will

qualify and operate as of July 1, 1971. Small breakers who do not qualify must discontinue July 1. Any product on hand should be inventoried and may be sold until June 30, 1972.

"Producer Packers are permitted to sell cracked eggs direct to household consumers," York said.

The group unanimously endorsed supporting a Symposium to be conducted by the Pennsylvania State University Advisory Council — to which Pennsylvania Senators and their wives will be invited by a donation of \$25.

Homer Bicksler reported that the Federation with the cooperation of the Department of Agriculture and the Restaurant Association staged a run-off or

the Egg Sandwich Contest Richard B Sweet of Philadelphia was the winner.

Bicksler announced that the Federation annual meeting will be held June 16 at the Sheraton Motel, New Cumberland RD. An especially good program has been developed that will be of interest to all egg marketing people, Bicksler said.

Following a discussion regarding meeting arrangements, it was decided that the PEMA should discontinue going to Schraffts, New Cumberland and move to The Embers Restaurant, Carlisle Pike, Carlisle. It was also agreed that inasmuch as meals are being escalated everywhere, charges to members attending must be escalated.

In the absence of President Earl Hess, Mr. Ben Burkholder presided.

The Treasurer's report was presented by R. Clair Sauder and accepted.

The group was advised to sign up for the NEPPCO Quality School to be held in June at Rutgers. They also observed a carton with printing, indicating that it was destroyable.

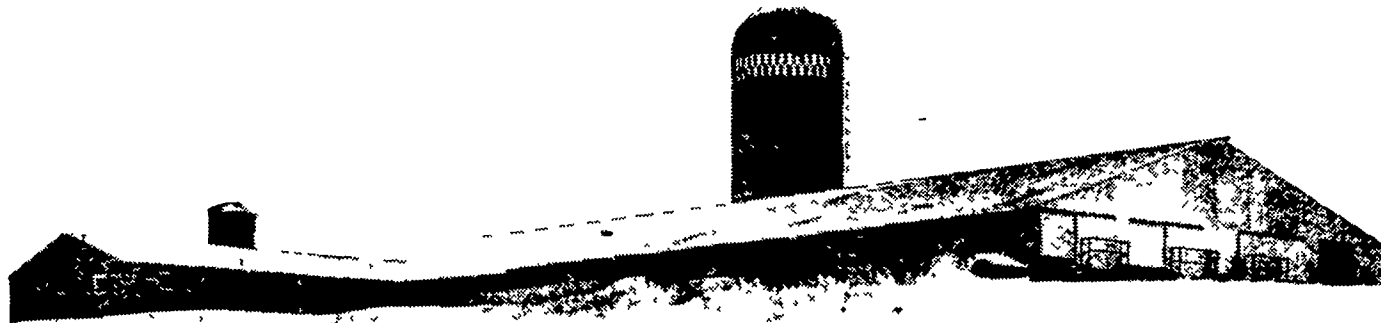
