The next meeting of the Merry Maids will be held on June 14 at Martin Meylin Junior High. The time for the meeting is 12:30 to 3 p.m.

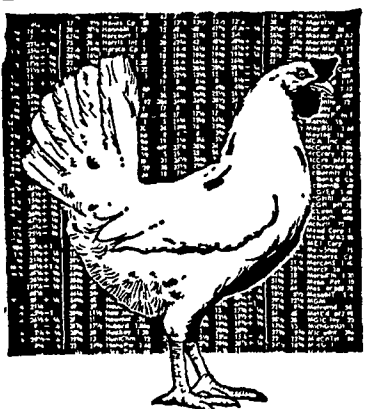

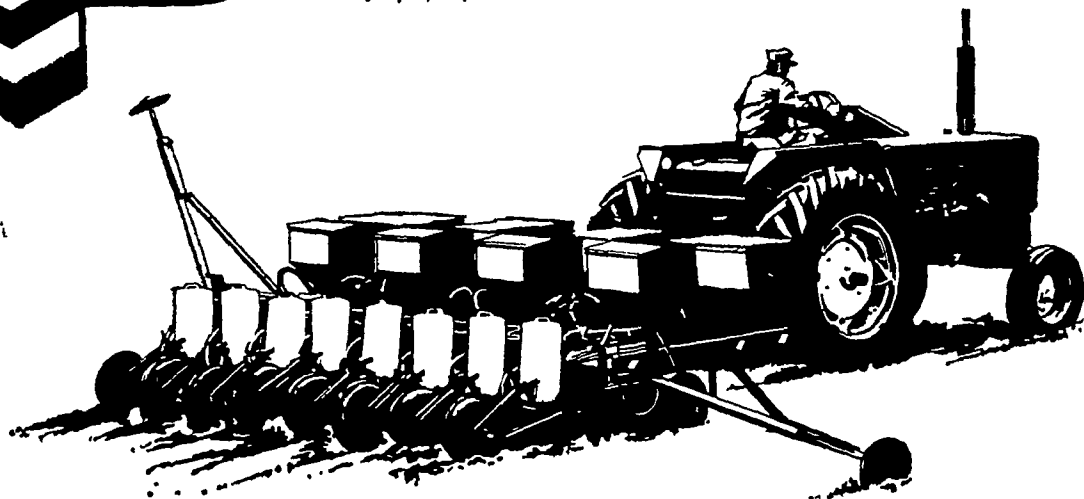
