Dairying Important 4-H Project Here

The 4-H Dairy project continues to be one of the most important club projects in Lancaster County.

Current enrollment in the three 4-H Dairy Clubs include 26 members in the Ayrshire-Jersey-Brown Swiss Club, 24 in the Guernsey Club, and 99 members in the Holstein Club. All of these clubs meet monthly and have regular programs relating to dairying and to youth development.

The project requires that each club member owns one or

more dairy heifers and develops the animal into a mature cow. Records are kept relating to feed, growth, production, and other important parts of the dairy business.

Dairy club members have an opportunity to give demonstrations at Club meetings regarding many phases of the dairy business and are urged to learn more about dairy cattle judging.

A county 4-H Dairy Judging Team is selected each year to compete in the state contest in August at Penn State. The dairy animals are shown at the local dairy show the last week in July, and then some are selected for the District Show at Harrisburg, and still the best of all get to compete in the Pennsylvania Junior Dairy Show at Harrisburg as a part of the All-American Dairy Cattle Show. Dairy club activities are a part of the youth program of the local Extension Service and the County Agents have the as-

sistance of 23 adult club leaders, who help the club members with their projects and many other activities.

Dairying is the most important agricultural enterprise in Lancaster County and the active 4-H Dairy Program has developed into one of the most important club projects.

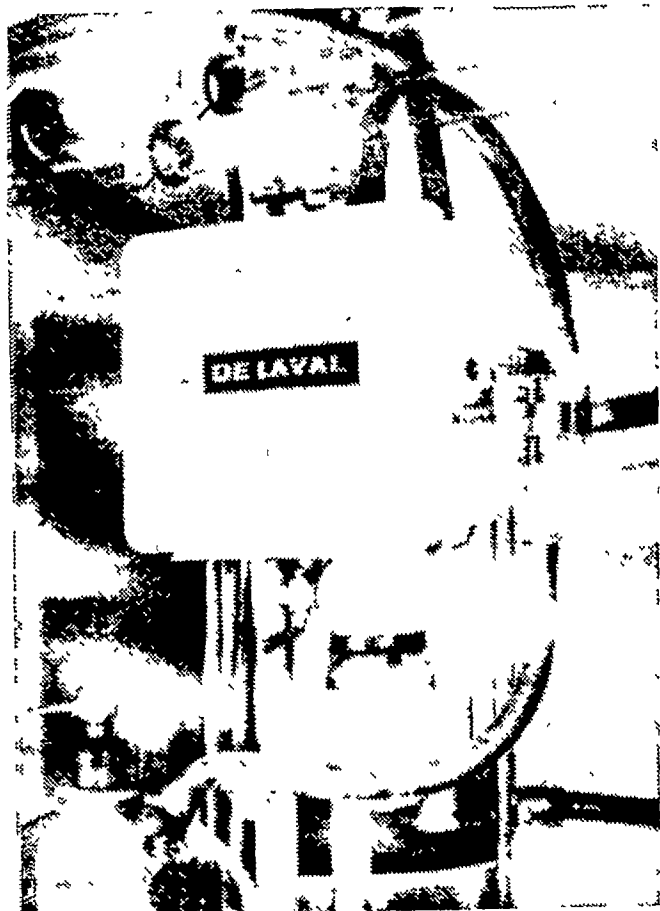
Paper Drive Scheduled
