

Brownstown Girl Wins Registered Ayrshire Heifer

A Brownstown Elementary school student has received a registered Ayrshire heifer calf for placing first among 600 Lancaster County sixth grade elementary students in a dairy judging contest.

She is Jennie Horning, daughter of Mr and Mrs Sylvan Horning, Ephrata RD2

The two and one half month old registered Ayrshire calf is from the farm of John B Ranck Jr, Penn Spring Farm, New Holland RD2

The outstanding calf was sired by Oakridge Royal Count, a proven sire out of Wheel of Fortune, and the dam is Silk Purse S Girl, which milked over 13,000 pounds during her last lactation.

The second place winner, Elvin Kurtz, son of Mr and Mrs J Edward Kurtz, Elverson RD2, received a \$25 savings bond

The winners were selected from competition in Hoard's annual dairy judging contest

Cheese Output Is Up

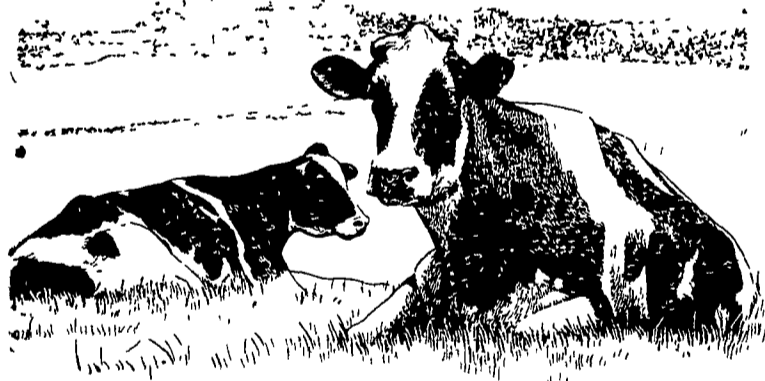
Miscellaneous or foreign-type cheese production, excluding cottage and full-skim American, totaled 74,565,000 pounds in March, exceeding last year's record high by 11 per cent.

Compared with March a year earlier, output was up for all

types except Brick, Muenster, Limburger and the All Other category

Total cheese production, American and miscellaneous types combined, was 198,950,000 pounds during March, a new record high for the month and six per cent above the previous record March high set last year

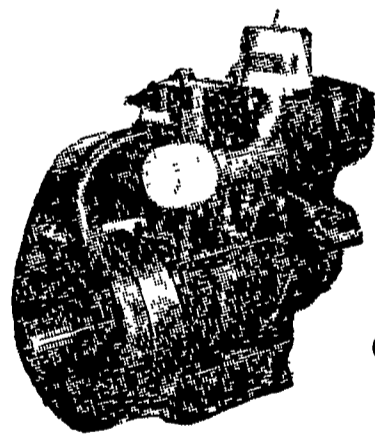
