## Ice Cream Sales Are Up

Production of ice cream during March was estimated at 64,085,000 gallons, the Crop Reporting Board reports.

This is the largest output on record for March, exceeding the previous record high of 63,900,000 gallons produced during March 1970.

Ice milk production was set at 20,675,000 gallons, also a new record high for the month and up two per cent from the previous record high in March 1970.

Sherbet production, estimated at 4,170,000 gallons, set a new record high for March, up two per cent from last year.


