Prices generally unchanged. Processor demand for light type hens still fair as some plants continue part-time operation. Offerings mostly adequate though short of needs in some instances where off-farm movement slowed by advancing egg prices. Offering of heavy type hens adequate for a seasonally fairly good call. Prices paid at farm: Light type hens 4-2-8 1/2 mostly 6 1/4-6 1/2 in Pennsylvania mostly 5-5 1/2 in New Jersey. Heavy type hens too few to report prices.

Prices generally unchanged to occasionally lower on mediums. Receipts light. Supplies of large declining and in a more closely balanced position this a.m. Extra large short and being pieced out at 37-41 1/2 cents. Mediums ample but irregularly distributed while smalls offered at 15-16 cents and failing to attract interest were accumulating. Standards however, are in a tighter supply situation. Buying activity continues quiet locally with a more nervous and unsettled undertone prevailing. Carton orders range

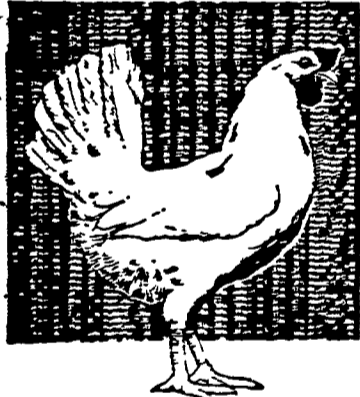
