

## Ephrata Twins Win Strawberry Roundup

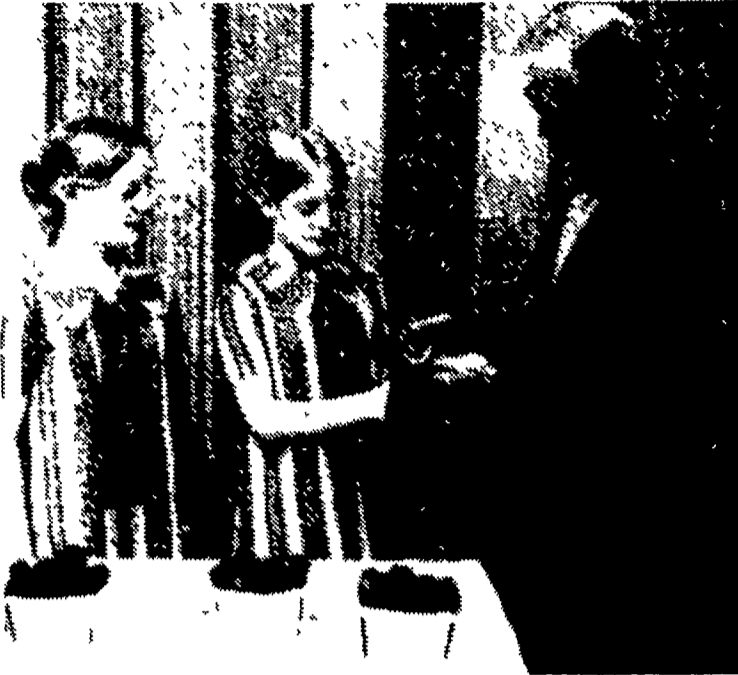
Ephrata RD1 twins were first and second place winners in the 4-H strawberry roundup Wednesday.

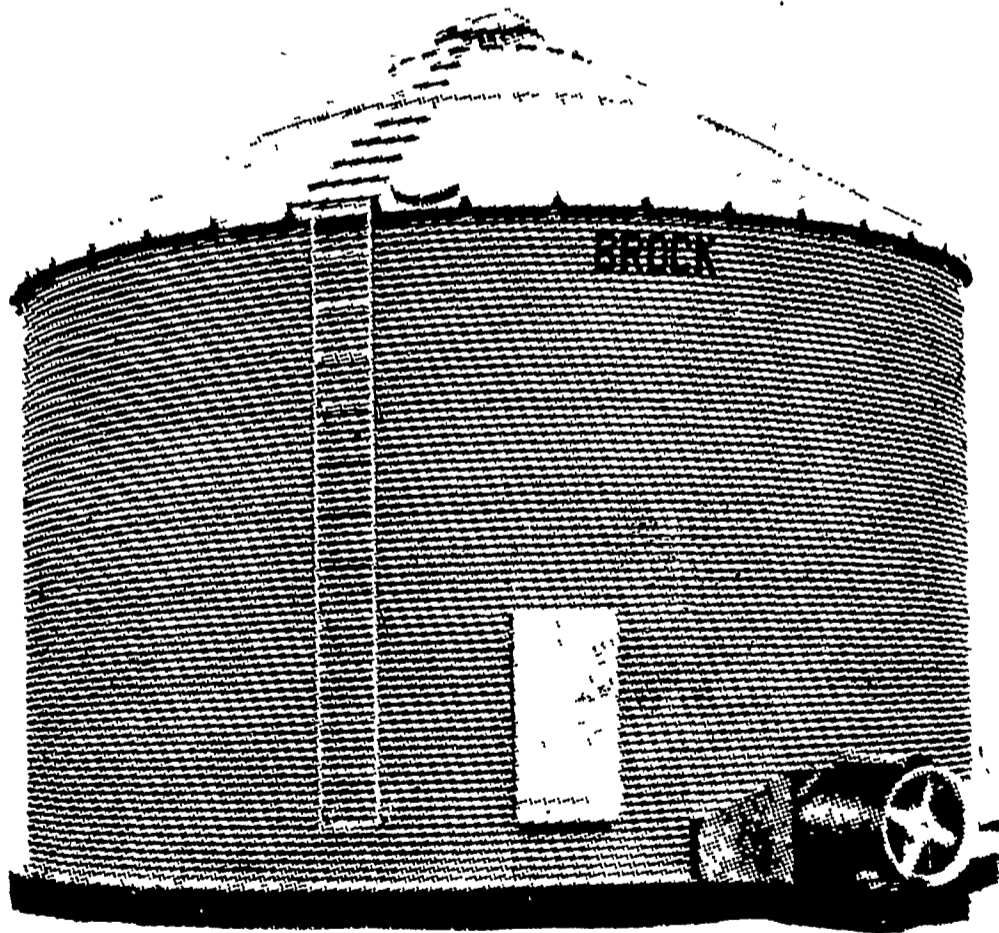

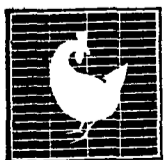
