## Chester County Agents Advise What to Do About the Blight

That Southern Corn Blight is now well established in South-eastern Pennsylvania is no longer news to farmers.

But many farmers may still be wondering what to do about it. Chester County Extension agents, Robert A. Powers Jr., county agent, and Glenn A. Shirk, associate county agent, offer the following comments and recommendations:

1. Do not destroy infected corn stands in order to plant an

alternative feed crop. Your present corn crop is now making more feed per day of growth than could be expected from a late-planted, alternative crop; also you avoid the risk of seeding failure and the cost of seeding. Severely damaged corn can be best salvaged as silage.

2. Do not consider using a preventive spray program. As many as 10 weekly applications may be needed. It is too costly, and control may be poor.

3. Stockpile feeds now and consider alternative feeding programs.

Save this year's small grain harvest for feed.

Combine small grains rather than ensiling them.

Don't sell grain presently in storage — you may need it for feed.

Get maximum forage production. Fertilize, spray for insects, harvest on time.

Stretch grain supplies by feeding more roughage.

Save the cobs at harvest time, they have feed value, too.

Reduce field losses.

4. Plan now for temporary feed storage facilities, if necessary.

5. Reduce the demand on present feed supplies.

Cull your herd and feed a minimum of replacement animals.

Don't add extra feeder animals to consume last year's crop.

6. Corn planted after barley harvest will be subjected to blight infection. N-hybrids will generally be less susceptible to blight than T-hybrids.

7. Be aware of herbicide soil residues remaining in corn fields when considering changes in crop rotation. Atrazine can be very damaging to soybeans, alfalfa, and small grain seedlings.

8. Continue with your present cropping program in 1972.

Don't switch to lower-yielding alternative crops this fall or next spring. Most experts agree that most of next year's seed corn will be of the N-cytoplasm type.

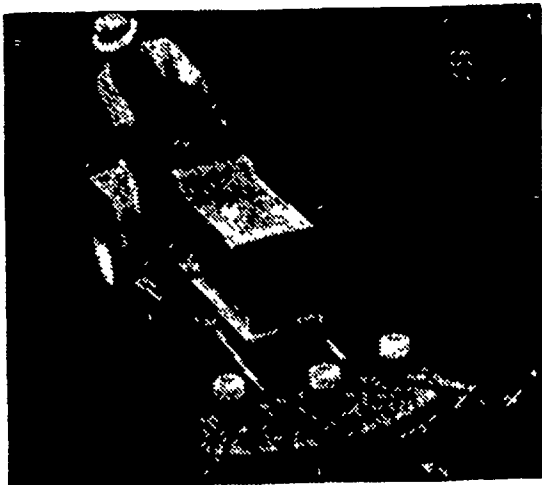

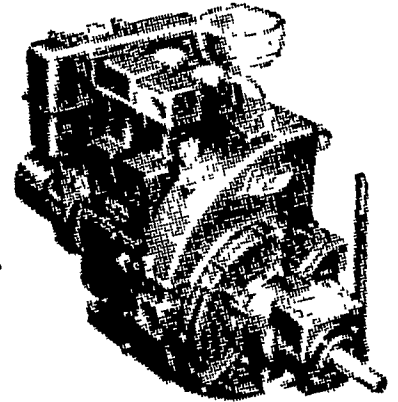
