Back to the subject of salads, Mrs. Isaac B. Good, Stevens RD 1, sends her original recipe which she calls "Delicious Potato Salad" as follows:

Delicious Potato Salad Salad:

4 cups cooked diced potatoes 2½ cups chopped celery

% cup shredded carrots

4 cup chopped onion 2 tablespoons chopped parsley 6 hard cooked eggs, diced or

Dressing

1 cup plus 1 tablespoon Mir-

acle Whip % cups sugar

3 cup vinegar

11/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper

¼ teaspoon paprika

1/4 teaspoon celery salt.

Combine first six ingredients after the potatoes and eggs are thoroughly cooled.

Prepare dressing by combining Miracle Whip and sugar; add vinegar and remaining seasonings and stir until well blended. Combine dressing with first six ingredients and chill.

Serves 10 to 12. Note: 4 cups cooked and drained macaroni may be substituted in place of potatoes.

Mrs. J. N. Shirk, Leola RD1, has a delicious potato salad recipe "for those who don't like mayonnaise" as follows:

Potato Salad

2 quarts cooked, diced potatoes

½ onion

5 hard cooked eggs 2 tablespoons finely chopped celery

Salt and pepper to suit taste. Dressing:

Beat all following ingredients together and put in double boiler, stirring till thick. Then cool and add to potato mixture:

1 cup vinegar

4 teaspoons cornstarch4 teaspoons butter

2 cups sugar

2 cups sugar4 eggs

Cream may be added before serving

Mrs. Ira H. Davis, Quarryville RD1, forwards her easy-to-make "Quick Picnic Salad" as follows: Quick Picnic Salad

Use number two can sliced or chunky pineapple (well drained). Add one can of cherry pie mix or make your own while cherries are in. Add 1½ cups small marshmallows and two sliced bananas.

Mrs. Herbert D. Eyman, 146 W Franklin St., Strasburg, has another quicky which she calls "Kidney Bean Salad" as follows: Kidney Bean Salad

1 can Kidney Beans

Onion and mayonnaise to taste.

Drain juice from beans and spray with water until beans are free from all juice.

Then mix onion and mayon-

naise as desired. This can be mixed at the picnic.

Recently our column featured cherries. Mrs Eyman combines cherries and salads in the following easy Cherry Salad recipe:

Cherry Salad

1 pint sweet cherries, drained1 small can crushed pineapple,drained

1 pack Strawberry jello
Make jello as directed using
juices from cherries and pineapple. Mix all together.

Thelma L. Pannebecker, Reinholds RD1, has a Hawaiian Salad which she notes as "A favorite of my family to take to a picnic":

Hawaiian Salad small packages orange jello

cups hot water

1 can frozen orange juice
When this is almost set, whip
until fluffy. Add 1 cup of whipping cream that has been whipped or one package of Dream
Whip or Ready Whip mixed as
per directions on package.

Add:

tablespoon salad dressing

cup miniature marshmallows
 cup pineapple ((crushed or tidbits), drained

1 small can Mandarin orange sections, cut in half, drained Drain juice from the oranges and pineapple before adding to the jello mixture.

Pour into a 9 x 13 inch pan or mold as desired.

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
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
