## Feed Hens Sitosterol?

Hens on a diet containing sitosterol produced eggs containing up to 35 per cent less cholesterol than eggs laid by the same hens when on standard rations, Kansas State University research has revealed.

Sitosterol is a fatty substance found in soybeans and other plants. It's been used successfully as a drug to lower blood and tissue cholesterol in humans.

Besides lowering cholesterol in the egg, it's expected that even a small amount of sitosterol present simultaneously in the egg along with cholesterol can prevent much of that cholesterol from being absorbed in the human intestine.

### COL. SANDERS' BISCUITS

2 cups flour  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1 tsp. baking powder  
1 (heaping) tbsp shortening  
1 cup buttermilk

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Sift flour, salt and baking powder together. Cut in shortening; add buttermilk; mix and roll out on floured board to about 1/2-inch thickness. Cut out biscuits and place on ungreased baking sheet. Bake about 10 minutes. Makes 12 to 15 biscuits.

### Forced Molting Cited

While reports generally have indicated prospects for a better egg market in the latter half of 1971, the Northeast Egg Marketing Association has issued the following comment in its newsletter:

"Fowl slaughter in the south and west has been off substantially since Easter and at times well below that of a year ago.

"As a result birds are being forced molted in record numbers and will soon start to re-enter the laying flock. If the practice is continued, it will keep egg prices depressed indefinitely and eliminate any chance for a profitable egg price this summer.

"It is reported that many southern producers are in the position of not being able to get financing for new pullets
