## Weaver Presents Safety Awards

Four applications have been received, but there are a total of up to 10 positions open. Application can be made by calling the conservation office at 299-5361.

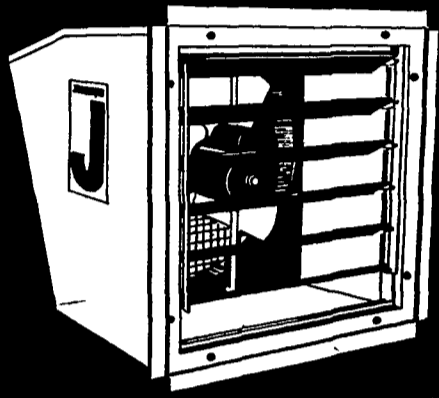
The contest will be held July 27 at the Roy Brook farm, Ronks RD1.

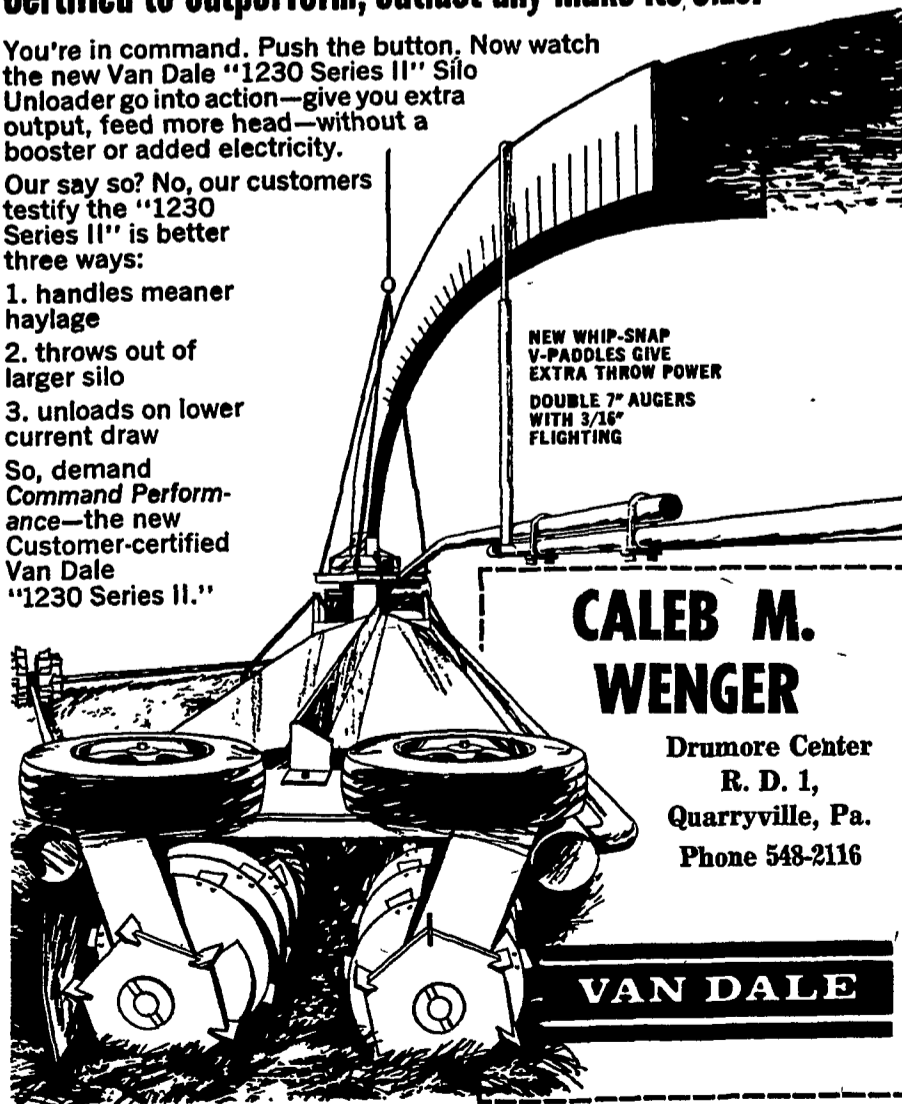

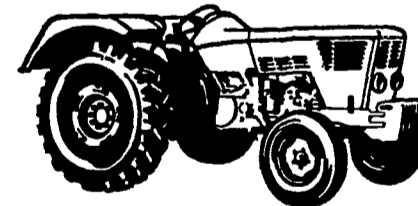
