

also sell milk in Pennsylvania and New York.

The low prices in New Jersey are only possible if higher prices can be charged in other areas to balance returns. This results in higher prices than are economically necessary in Pennsylvania particularly.

Before any substantial change is made in the operation of milk price regulation in Pennsylvania, the uneconomic situation in New Jersey should be corrected.

6. The low prices in New Jersey have not contributed to higher milk consumption. In fact, the opposite is true.

The continued harangue about milk and politics in New Jersey has resulted in a greater rate of decline in consumption in New Jersey than the national average.

I submit that resale pricing contributes most to the desired goal of dairy farmers for a stable market.

Without reasonable price regulation, disastrous circumstances will result. Markets will disappear and consumers will be paying higher milk prices in the long run.


