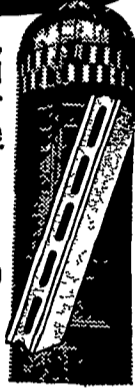

**EMERGENCY HAY**

The Agricultural Act of 1970 proves that a farmer may harvest and store hay from the higher of 25 per cent or 25 acres of the farm's total set-aside acreage, for use in an emergency in a later year.

Before harvesting, the farmer must file written application and receive approval from the County ASC Committee. Harvesting without written approval will be considered a program violation.

If approved, the hay must be baled and stored until released by the County Committee in the event of an emergency.

**True Cost of Meat**

Price per pound is only part of the answer to the true cost of meat you buy. Cost per serving is the real guide, says Harold E. Neigh, Extension consumer economics specialist at The Pennsylvania State University. Cost per serving is figured by dividing the price per pound by the number of expected servings.

Boneless meat yields four servings per pound, meat with a small amount of bone yields three servings, meat with a medium amount of bone such as blade chuck and pork loin yields three servings, meat with a medium amount of bone such as blade chuck and pork loin yields two servings, and meat with a large amount of bone gives only one serving per pound.
