Denier is the weight and thickness of a strand of nylon yarn. The lower the denier, the thinner the yarn and thus the sheerer the stocking. Very sheer hose are around seven denier, and heavier stockings will be 40 to 50 denier.

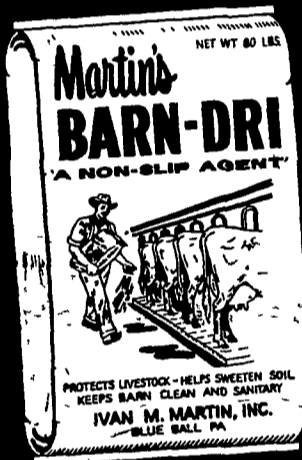

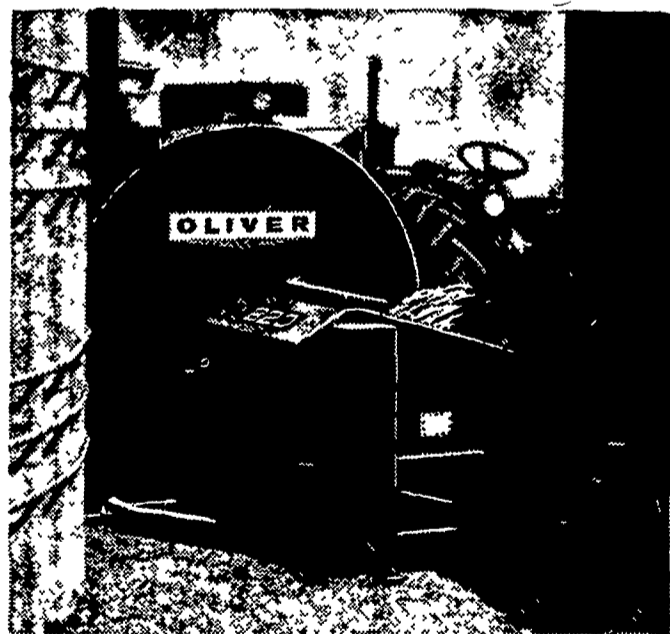

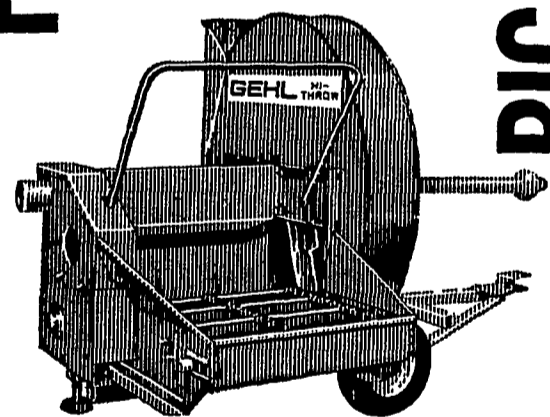
