State Helps With Egg Marketing

Larry Kegerreis, state department marketing specialist, informed several local members of the Pennsylvania Poultry Federation about a new state-originated egg marketing tool at a special meeting Tuesday at the Holiday Inn, Lancaster.

The new marketing tool is a flip chart explaining key facts and figures about the egg industry, particularly about how eggs can play an important role in the retail store owner's

sales and income.

Kegerreis said the state is also working with the Pennsylvania Grocers Association to reach small independent stores, will inform wholesalers that the information is available, and will prepare a slide presentation for larger groups. Kegerreis is also talking with groups of egg packers. Several meetings have already been held to explain the value of the information to the egg industry and additional meetings are planned in the future.
