
Rumen Important

Miss Cindy Hess, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Hess, Strasburg RD1, gave her 4-H demonstration on "No Hay Rations Can Spell Trouble." She emphasized that the rumen is one of the most important parts of the cow and the rumen must be kept in excellent condition in order for the cow to perform

Coarse, hard, stemmy material is essential to make the rumen muscles work hard and keep it in excellent condition. This type of material is important near the end of the lactation and during the dry period, she said.

Miss Hess emphasized that disease and breeding problems can occur if the rumen is not kept in good condition. During the dry period, she recommend-
