ed a minimum of five pounds of coarse hay and limiting corn silage to not more than eight to 10 pounds. She also said that haylage can be fed with the hay.

Earl Stauffer, Ephrata RD1, the Pennsylvania Holstein Boy, and Susan Kauffman, the Pennsylvania Holstein Girl, as well as the new Lancaster County dairy princess, spoke briefly. Stauffer noted the junior Holstein convention will be held November 19.

Max Smith, Lancaster County ag agent, introduced the new assistant county agent, N. Alan Bair, as a product of a York County black and white farm who has obtained both his bachelors and masters degrees in dairy science at Penn State University. Bair greeted the farmers.

Smith also noted that it's time to begin thinking of planting alfalfa. He noted that the 1971 agricultural Progress days will be held at the Penn State University ag research center three miles west of Pine Grove Mills August 31 - September 2.

Smith said that the wet weather of the past several days has been ideal for the spread of the Southern Corn blight. He suggested that farmers who find 10 or more lesions or leaves above the corn should consider a fungicide spray as a means of saving their crop between now and maturity. While the cost will be high for such a program, it must be weighed in terms of saving the crop from a possible complete loss, if the blight does strike, Smith said.
