### Virulent Newcastle Disease Reported

Entry permits are no longer being issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture for poultry or eggs for hatching from countries where outbreaks of Newcastle disease have reached high levels.

Newcastle, a viral disease of poultry and other birds, is widespread in Europe, South America, Central America, Asia, and Africa.

USDA has asked Federal agencies responsible for imported birds other than those regulated by USDA to help stop entry of birds that might carry the disease

Countries for which entry permits are no longer being issued include. France, Greece,

The Old Timer

"A scandal is a breeze stirred up by a couple of windbags." Hong Kong, India, Iran, Israel, Korea, Lebanon, Mexico, the Netherlands, Poland, Russia, the United Kingdom, Venezuela, West Germany and Yugoslavia.

Animal health officials of USDA's Agricultural Research Service say that the disease is not widespread in the United States. If the disease should reach epidemic status, the result could be as disastrous to the multibillion dollar US. poultry industry as it is proving to be in the countries now confronted with this disease problem, they say.

However, during the past few months the disease has been diagnosed in New York, Texas, New Mexico, and Florida In August 1970, all birds of South American origin in a New York City pet shop died of a virulent strain of Newcastle disease not previously seen in the United States.

Early in 1971 there were known outbreaks in Texas and New Mexico in layer flocks. Two flocks of diseased chickens in New Mexico are now under State quarantine and a Federal quarantine is under consideration

Several small flocks in Texas and New Mexico have had dis-

ease outbreaks with high mortality during the past several months; whether Newcastle has been the cause has not been determined.

In Florida, all ornamental birds used for breeding studies by one scientist either died or were destroyed because of the disease. Officials say that the same virus was found in all outbreaks.

ARS officials remind poultrymen that it is important to reevaluate their vaccination programs. Officials point out the licensed vaccines are effective when properly used.

Poultrymen also are advised that additional steps can be taken to prevent Newcastle dis ease from infecting their flocks. These are: 1) excluding visitors; 2) changing clothes and disinfecting footwear of all individuals moving from premise to premise; 3) obtaining replacement stock from reliable sources; 4) cleaning and disinfecting trucks or crates used to transport birds; 5) proper disposal of dead birds; 6) cleaning and disinfecting feed sacks before reuse; 7) cleaning and sanitizing egg cases and liners before reuse; and 8) replacement of contaminated litter.




