## Retail Egg Prices Are Not Frozen

United Egg Producers, the nation's largest egg marketing cooperative, cautioned consumers Tuesday not to be concerned if they see egg prices at their retail outlets continue to fluctuate during the next 90 days.

Jerry Faulkner, Executive Vice Preisdent and General Manager, said fresh shell eggs are not subject to President Nixon's announced 90-day emer-

gency wage-price freeze. He said eggs in the shell are "raw agricultural products" which were exempted by the President

Faulkner noted that egg prices for the past several months have been much lower than in recent years, and prices received by producers have been below the cost of production for some time. Had the President included eggs in the price freeze, Faulkner said, he would have locked many

small producers into bankruptcy. "We wish to make consumers aware that egg prices are subject to change," Faulkner said "Generally, the egg market rises in September and October under normal conditions. Unless the market remains free to seek its true supply-demand price level, many small producers will be forced out of business and our industry will consist of a few large corporations."

Some retail stores have indicated to UE.P. they plan to stick to a one-price system during the 90-day period to avoid any consumer reaction. Faulkner stated. This policy may force even higher prices upon consumers following the period since a voluntary retail price freeze could have the effect of setting a one-price policy to producers

"We feel consumers have had excellent bargains in egg prices in 1971," Faulkner continued, "but they must be aware that low egg prices cannot continue indefinitely if egg producers are to survive. If large numbers of production units are sent into bankruptcy by either mandatory or voluntary retail price freezes, future egg prices will skyrocket from the lack of supply.'

## Milk Market Amended

The US Department of Agriculture has issued an emergency final decision on a proposed amendment to the Middle Atlantic Federal milk marketing

USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service said the proposed amendment would increase from


15 to 25 per cent the allowable diversions to nonpool plants of cooperative and non-member milk for any months of September through February Unlimited diversions to nonpool plants still would be permitted March through August

Orderly marketing of reserve milk supplies requires that the amendment go into effect September 1. Therefore, the usual recommended decision and period in which to file exceptions have been eliminated, the USDA explained This procedure was a consideration at the hearing, and C&MS officials said there was no opposition expressed

The proposal is subject to approval by at least two-thirds of the dairy farmers serving the market This will be determined by polling their cooperative associations, C&MS officials said

Today's final decision is based on evidence from a public hearing in Bala Cynwyd, July 26. held at the request of a Philadelphia-based dairy farmer cooperative


