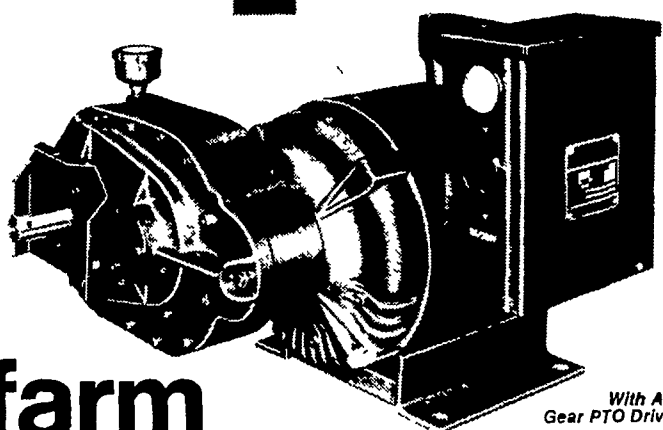

Projects were checked and discussed for Achievement Day. A volleyball game was enjoyed by everyone and refreshments were served.

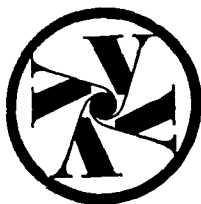
