The second place county group of Brown Swiss was exhibited by Chester County; Holstein exhibitors had the fourth place county group.

Chester County 4-H members exhibited a total of 60 head of cattle at the district show. Thirty-one of these were awarded blue ribbons, and became eligible to compete at the Pennsylvania Junior Dairy Show to be held September 20 at the Farm Show Building in Harrisburg.

During the course of the show, 4-H members who did an outstanding job of fitting and showing their animals were given master fitter and master showman awards. Among the recipients of the master fitter award were: Tina Kulp, Pottstown; Harry Leininger and David Nolan, both of Birchrunville; Percy Reynolds, Oxford; David Weinstock, Phoenixville; Nancy Wollaston, Toughkenamon; Susan Pepple and Patricia Devoe, both of Oxford; and James Wertz, Downingtown. Master showman were: James Wertz; Robert No-

lan, Birchrunville; and Susan Weaver, Glen Moore.

Judges for the show were Harry Roth, sire analyst, Atlantic Breeders Cooperative, Lancaster, for Holstein; and M. B. Sowerby, Guernsey classifier, Princeton, N.J. for Jerseys, Ayrshires, Milking Shorthorn, and Brown Swiss.

The Southeast District 4-H Dairy Show was sponsored by the Cooperative Extension Offices of the nine counties participating and the Cooperative Extension Service of Pennsylvania State University.

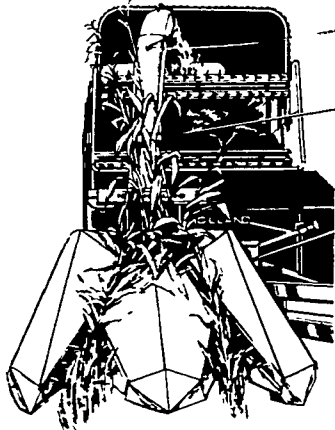

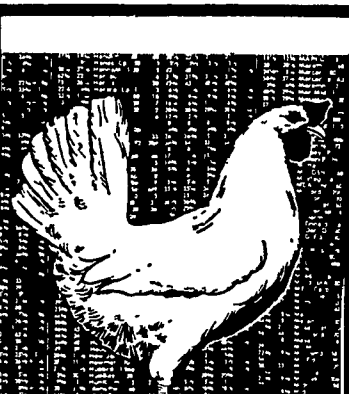
