

# Schaefferstown Fair Slated

The fourth annual Harvest Fair will be held at Schaefferstown Saturday September 18 and Sunday September 19. The time will be from 10 a.m. to dusk on Friday, and 12 noon to dusk on Sunday on the Old Schaeffer Farm in Schaefferstown.

Traditional Fall Activities such as schnitzing, apple butter boiling, cider making, threshing, corn meal grinding, cooking; demonstrations will take place each day.

There will be an art exhibit on the barn floor. First, second and third cash prizes will be awarded, plus a fourth which will be a people's choice.

Craftsmen will be demonstrating knitting, egg decorating, tatting, cigar making by hand, tin smithing, candle making, tole ware painting, ceramics, chair caning, plus many other old time skills.

A highlight of the Harvest Fair will be the aroma of baked bread, once daily in the 18th century brick oven.

Another highlight will be the First Annual Eastern Pennsylvania Horse Plowing Contest Saturday, September 18th only at 1 p.m. Cash prizes will be awarded to the winners in seven different categories.

Local people, farmers, FFA, FHA, and 4H members will be exhibiting grain, fruits, vegetables, canned goods, floral arrangements, sewing, crocheting, knitting, and other articles. Cash prizes will be offered.

There will be entertainment both days. Saturday will feature the Heidelberg Polka Band at 12 noon, Denim Dueters (from Robesonia) at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., Minute Men Quartette at 3 p.m. and 5 p.m., Bag Pipe music at 5:30 p.m., and a Hymn Sing at 6 p.m. led by the Minute Men Quartette.

Sunday's program will feature The Heidelberg Polka Band at 12 noon, Farm Womens Kitchen hooks at 2 and 4 p.m., G.T.V. Edelweiss of Reading Liederkrantz (Bavarian Folk Dancers) 3:30 and 5 p.m., Mixed Quartette from St. Paul's UCC of Schaefferstown, at 3 p.m. and Mixed Octette from the Heidelberg Brethren Church of Reistville.

Food will include sausage sandwiches, pork and sauer kraut, vegetable soup, funnel cakes, hot beef sandwiches, hamburgers, hot dogs, french fries, ice cream.

Admission each day will be \$1 for adults and 25 cents for children.
