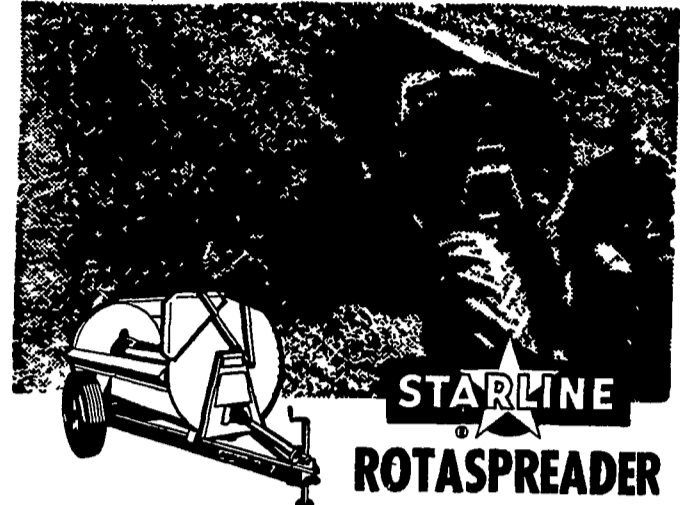


4-H Dairy Team Is Third
