The initials INRI seen at the top of the cross in pic-tures of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ is taken from the Latin words which Pontius Pilate ordered inscribed on the cross: "Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum" (Jesus of Nazareth, king of the Jews) as recorded in the Pook of John in the New Testament of the Bible.
