The open house program will begin at 10 a.m. with a business meeting of the Maryland Ar-

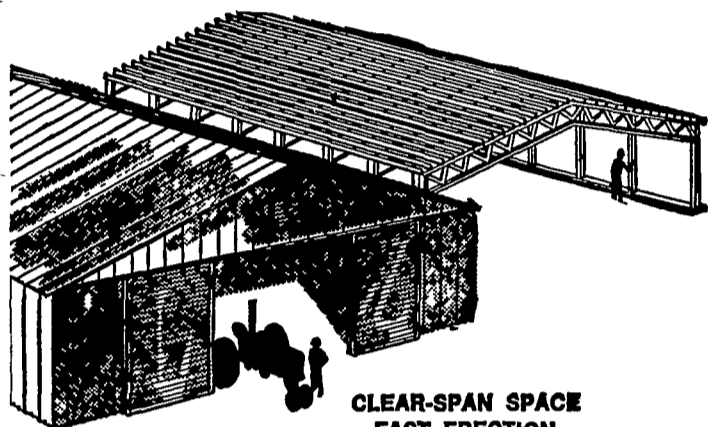
Cooperators Announced

Local FFA Members Place High at Springfield

Several Lancaster County FFA members placed high in competition recently at the Eastern States Exposition, Springfield, Mass.

Russell Kline, Reinholds, representing the Cloister FFA Chapter of Ephrata, was fifth high individual scorer in the dairy cattle judging contest. He was also one of three members of the first place Pennsylvania team. There were 11 state teams competing.

Among six teams in the small gas engines contest, the Lancaster County team representing Pennsylvania was third. Team members were Tony Haldeman and Amos Sauder, of the Manheim Central FFA Chapter.

In the dairy products judging contest, Paul Horning, Stevens RD1, of Cloister FFA Chapter, placed fifth. Horning was also one of three members of the Pennsylvania team which placed third out of 10 state teams.

In the poultry products judging contest, two Lancaster County FFA members were among the top 10 in individual placings.

Jim Charles of Penn Manor FFA Chapter was sixth and Roy Fasnacht of Cloister FFA

Chapter was ninth. The Pennsylvania poultry team was sixth out of 10 state team entries.

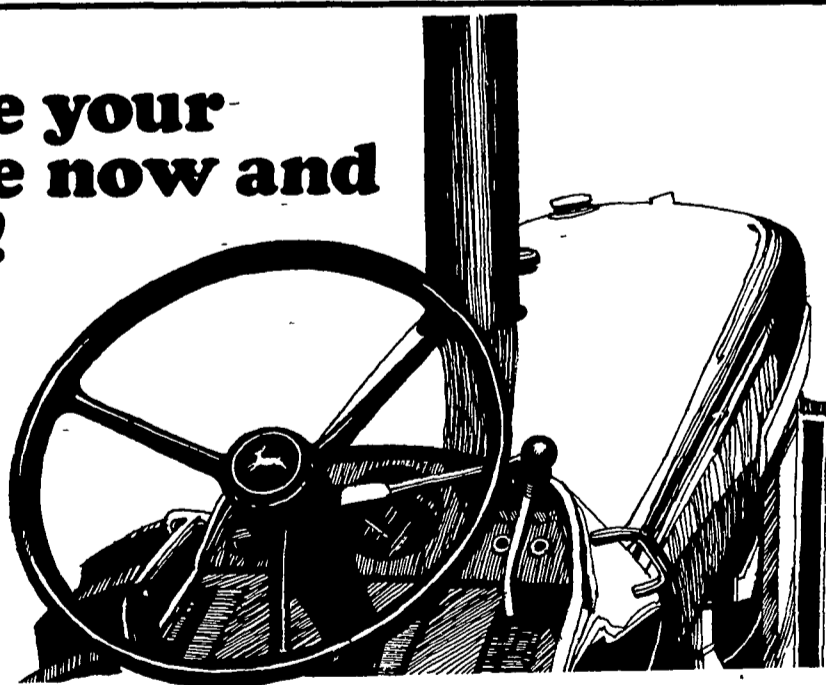
