This year's workshop is scheduled for October 25-26, and will be held in the Meat Board offices in Chicago.

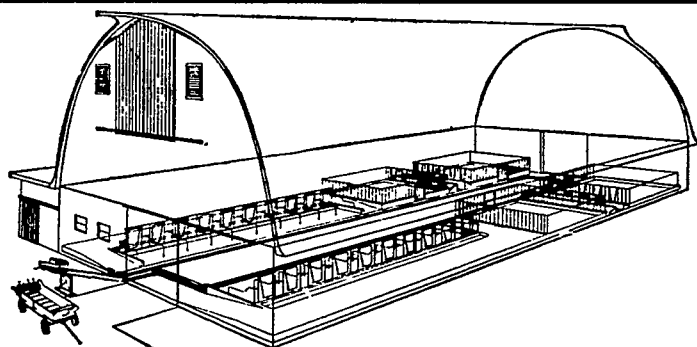
A National Decline

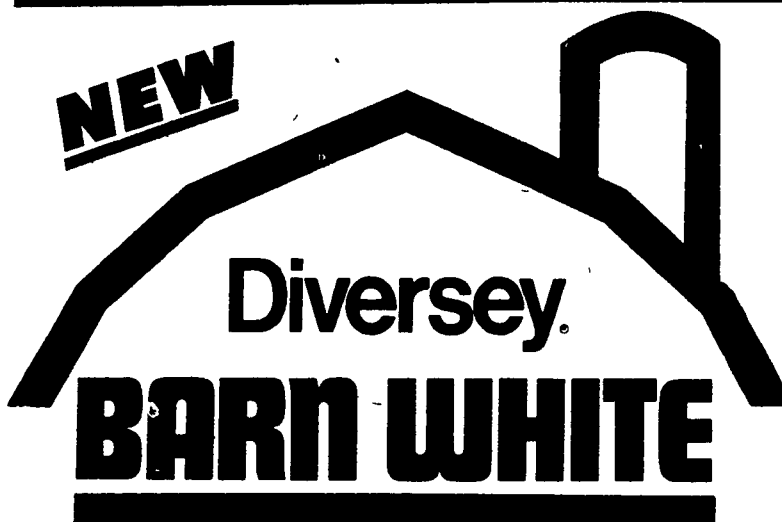
They also went on record in favor of Congress passing a law to permit Bible reading in our public schools and, if passed, sent to the states for ratification.

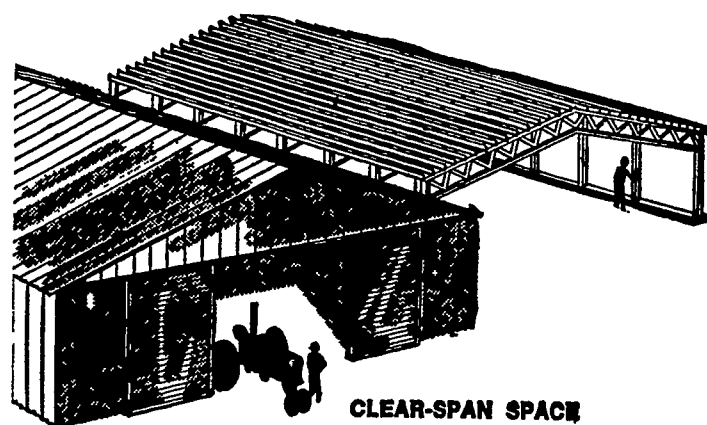

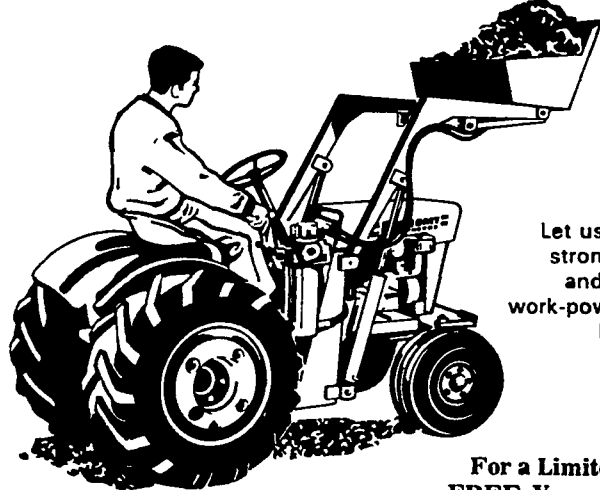
